

# CITY LIVING

#### **AUSTRALIAN CITIES IN THE 1930s**


By the 1930s, most Australian cities had electric lighting, and good water and drainage systems. However, World War I had slowed down development, and the Great Depression had a similar effect.

Each city had its own look and feel. Sydney and Melbourne were the largest and most impressive. Adelaide, with William Light's carefully planned grid of streets and greenbelts, was described as having 'environmental and cultural grace'. Brisbane, built along the meandering Brisbane River, was 'tranquil and tropical', with an informal friendliness. Perth was a lively and growing city but, as Western Australia relied heavily on primary products for its wealth, it was badly affected by the Depression. Hobart was the second-oldest city after Sydney, and was renowned for its colonial-era buildings and harbour setting. Like the new capital city of Canberra, Darwin was still a 'frontier outpost'. It had a small but racially diverse population, with many people still living in shanties and huts.
